**Grammar:**

UNIT 6 - speculation about the past, present and future: must have/ can't have/ may have/could have/might have + past participle, have to/must + infinitive, can't + infinitive, may, could, might + infinitive, expressions of probability and possibility, emphasis and inversion;

UNIT 7: conditionals (first, second, third, mixed conditionals);

UNIT 8: the passive, more passive structures, the passive with verbs with two objects, the passive with reporting verbs;

UNIT 9: reported speech, adverbs with two forms, verb patterns in reported speech, yes/no questions, wh questions in reported speech;

UNIT 10: defining relative clauses, sentence relative clauses, non-defining relative clauses, participle clauses.
